WHAT TO DO IF YOU STRIKE A PIPELINE OR SUSPECT A LEAK

Whether it appears there is damage or not, follow these steps:

Stop all excavation and construction work and move away from the area on foot: let others know to do the same.

- 1. Shut off all equipment and machinery
- 2. Call 9-1-1 as soon as you are in a safe location
- Call Husky Midstream's emergency number 1-877-458-8080 and explain the situation
- **4.** Do NOT attempt to operate any valves
- **5.** Do NOT begin work again until a Husky Midstream representative authorizes you to do so

HOW TO IDENTIFY A LEAK

Look:

- A pool of liquid
- Continuous bubbling in wet or flooded areas
- A rainbow or a sheen on water or flat surfaces
- Unexpected frost or ice on the ground
- Discoloured snow or discolored/dead vegetation
- A white vapour stream or mist-like cloud over the pipeline
- Dirt being blown or appearing to be thrown in the air

Smell:

• Unusual odour or scent of petroleum

Listen:

 Unusual noise coming from a pipeline riser (valves on the surface)



As a reminder, always call or click before you start any work, and dig with care.

TIPS FOR FARMERS

Some farm work can put you at risk of striking a pipeline:

- Sub-soiling, digging or cleaning ditches can damage a pipeline due to the equipment penetrating well below the surface of the land.
- Land leveling can reduce the depth at which the pipeline is buried, leaving it vulnerable to future digging or excavation.

You are receiving this brochure because you live or work near a Husky Midstream pipeline.

Husky Midstream is committed to the safety of the public, our workforce and the environment. As part of that commitment, we want our neighbours to be aware of the location of all our pipelines (provincially regulated pipelines and those pipelines that cross provincial boundaries that are regulated by the Canada Energy Regulator (CER)).

This information provides you with important steps to take when living and working around pipelines. Important emergency contact information is also included.

To ensure the safety of our neighbours and our workers, Husky Midstream has in place:

- A thorough pipeline integrity management program
- A monitoring system to monitor pipeline operations 24 hours a day
- Regular patrols of our rights-of-way
- Clear rights-of-way and markers along our pipelines routes

The leading causes of pipeline incidents or damage are excavation, digging and grading. Learning how to work safely around pipelines will help:

- Protect you and the public from injury
- Prevent damages to utilities
- Prevent service disruption
- Avoid fines and repair costs

Following these three steps will help you to safely dig or perform farming and other activities near Husky Midstream pipelines.

STEP 1: CALL OR CLICK

Before any ground disturbance activity is performed arrangements will be made to have the location of the pipelines marked. Never assume the location or the depth of a pipeline.

STEP 2: LOOK FOR MARKERS

Husky Midstream has installed markers at regular intervals along our pipelines and at road and rail crossings. Husky Midstream pipeline markers show the general location of a pipeline, they do not show how deep the pipeline is buried nor how many lines are underground.

STEP 3: CONTACT HUSKY MIDSTREAM

Husky Midstream should be notified when working near our pipelines or facilities. It is important to alert Husky Midstream if workers or crews are crossing the rights-of-way with motorized equipment or vehicles.
